

# HIV/AIDS 2024 Annual Report

## Division of Health Equity and Social Justice



The Office of HIV/AIDS responds to the HIV epidemic in Cleveland and Cuyahoga County. CDPH coordinates services to prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS and improves health outcomes for those at risk for, living with, or affected by HIV.

### Highlights

- NEOCH successfully supported 72 clients in securing leased units through the HOPWA Short-Term Supported Housing program, assisted 10 clients in transitioning to other HOPWA housing programs, and helped 20 clients move into private housing.
- In May 2024, AFC, a CDBG partner, participated in the release of House Bills 513 and 498 at the Ohio Statehouse. These bills, aim to modernize HIV-related criminal laws in Ohio as part of the Ohio Health Modernization Movement.
- Partnered with 5 HOPWA partners, ATGC, Joseph and Mary Home, NEOCH, NLURC & EDEN, and 7 CDBG partners, AFC, ATGC, The Centers, NEON, NLURC, WT4AC & LGBT Center

### 2024 By the Numbers

- 653** HOPWA clients received rental or mortgage assistance.
- 3,221** HOPWA clients received nutrition, transportation or case management

### 2024 By the Numbers

- 49,978** Persons reached through CDBG community outreach.
- 3,440** HIV and STI tests administered through CDBG-funded programs.
