# Bridge Avenue Resurfacing Project Traffic Advisory West 57<sup>th</sup> Street to West 65<sup>th</sup> Street (Ward 15)

**CLEVELAND** – Beginning the week of May 26, 2025, weather permitting, the City will begin asphalt resurfacing on Bridge Avenue from West 57<sup>th</sup> Street to West 65<sup>th</sup> Street.

#### **Overall Project Description:**

The project includes resurfacing the street from West 57<sup>th</sup> Street to West 65<sup>th</sup> Street. In addition, new ADA ramps and pavement markings will be installed. The work is scheduled from May 26 to June 30 from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

#### **Maintenance of Traffic:**

Two-way traffic will be maintained on Bridge Avenue at all times except when a brief, temporary closure is needed, one lane of traffic will remain. No on street parking will be permitted during paving operations.

Driveway and pedestrian access will be maintained while the contractor works on road.

Advanced warning signs will be placed outside of the work zone, informing the public of the construction work and any changes in the traffic patterns. Access to residences and businesses will be maintained throughout construction.
