#### **QUESTION #1:**

The Specifications for the playground equipment have the GT Splash as requested equipment while the drawings have the GT Wave with a stainless steel slide; which piece of equipment is preferred?

#### **ANSWER:**

The GT Wave w/ plastic slide is the preferred play equipment.

#### **QUESTION #2:**

The specification for the swings have a (2) Bay ADA Xscape Swing w/ (2) Belt Seats w/ Clevis and (2) Expression Swing Seats and (2) Tot Swing Seats. The specification implies that the Tot Swing Seats are extra stock, is this true or is this a description of the expression swings?

#### **ANSWER:**

The swing plan calls for: (2) Bay ADA Xscape Swing w/ (2) Belt Seats w/ Clevis and (1) Expression Swing Seats and (1) Tot Swing Seat.

b. Boiled Linseed Oil - State Item 708.02.

c. Turpentine (Gum Spirits) Type I - State Item 708.03.

d. White Paint and Tinted Paints made on white base - State Item 708.05.

e. White Paint (prime coat for wood) - State Item 708.05.

f. Black Paint (for wood or metal) - State Item 708.11.

g. Graphite Paint for wood finish coat or metal following Red (State Item 708.06) - State Item 708.13.

h. Aluminum Paint for wood as prime finish coats or for metal as finish coats following Red (State Item 708.06) - State Item 708.12

i. Black Enamel (outdoor use on metal) - State Item 708.10. NOTE: In State Item 708.10, substitute jet black for green.

j. Prime Paint for metal - State Item 708.15.

2. MASONRY & CONCRETE PAINT: paint for use on concrete shall be alkydoleoresinous, silicone reinforced material, Hydrocide Colorcoat or approved equal. It shall be alkali resistant and have a minimum vapor transmission rate of 3.5 grams per 100 square inches per twenty four (24) hours to permit breathing. It shall be resistant to common industrial fumes, water and humidity.

a. APPLICATION: Paint shall be applied by brush, spray or roller in strict conformity with the manufacturer's printed instructions. The paint film shall form a continuous sheath free from skips, pinholes and other imperfections. Paint shall be applied at the rate of coverage specified by the manufacturer.

3. SYNTHETIC ENAMELS: when synthetic enamels are specified, alternate trade name color shall be given. The contractor shall exercise his choice as to manufacturer, but shall use the color(s) made by the manufacturer of his choice.
  - a. THE "INDUSTRIAL ENAMELS": the "52 Series Industrial Enamel Paint" are manufactured by Sherwin Williams Inc., Cleveland, Ohio. Bare metal: First coat shall be Zinc Chromate #35. After application, wash with clean water and allow the surface to dry. The second and third coats shall be 52 Series Enamel of the color specified.

### PART III - EXECUTION

#### 2.2 PLAY EQUIPMENT INSTALLATION

- A. Cleanup: on completion of the play equipment installation. Remove all excess materials and properly dispose of all empty containers and construction debris.

- B. When erection work is complete, including all riveting, straightening, etc., all adhering rust, scale, grease, etc., shall be removed. Oil and grease by appropriate solvents; dust and dirt by wood fiber brush; scale and other adhering material by wire brush or sand blasting. All items are to then be washed cleaned. This also applies to concrete surface to be painted.

It shall be alkali resistant and have a minimum vapor transmission rate of 3.5 grams per 100 square inches per twenty four (24) hours to permit breathing. It shall be resistant to common industrial fumes, water and humidity.
    - a. APPLICATION: Paint shall be applied by brush, spray or roller in strict conformity with the manufacturer's printed instructions. The paint film shall form a continuous sheath free from skips, pinholes and other imperfections. Paint shall be applied at the rate of coverage specified by the manufacturer.

3. SYNTHETIC ENAMELS: when synthetic enamels are specified, alternate trade name color shall be given. The contractor shall exercise his choice as to manufacturer, but shall use the color(s) made by the manufacturer of his choice.
  - a. THE "INDUSTRIAL ENAMELS": the "52 Series Industrial Enamel Paint" are manufactured by Sherwin Williams Inc., Cleveland, Ohio. Bare metal: First coat shall be Zinc Chromate #35. After application, wash with clean water and allow the surface to dry. The second and third coats shall be 52 Series Enamel of the color specified.

### PART III - EXECUTION

#### 2.2 PLAY EQUIPMENT INSTALLATION

- A. Comply with manufacturer's written installation instructions unless more stringent requirements are indicated.
- B. The contractor shall furnish and install custom play structure including concrete footers as described in the Schedule of Items. Locate as shown on plan or as directed by the Landscape Architect, all in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.
- C. ABSOLUTELY NO PLAYGROUND APPARATUS SHALL BE INSTALLED PRIOR TO THE SCHEDULING OF SAFETY SURFACE INSTALLATION AND THAN NO SOONER THAN TWO (2) DAYS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF SAFETY SURFACE INSTALLATION. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- D. The Contractor shall provide the City with swing seats including chain as described in the Schedule of Items. The seats with chains attached along with all manuals, hardware and/or special tools provided by the manufacturer shall be given to the City upon delivery to the Inspector and/or Project Manager.

#### 2.3 PAINTING

- A. All painting shall be done in dry weather, air and material temperatures being at least fifty degrees Fahrenheit. In warm weather, painting shall not be done when absorbed heat causes paint to blister. Each coat shall be followed by the successive coat only after the previous coat is thoroughly dry.
- B. All paint and paint materials shall be delivered in the manufacturer's original package, unopened with label intact. Packages shall be opened in the presence of the Director's representative.

#### 2.4 CLEANING

- A. Cleanup: on completion of the play equipment installation. Remove all excess materials and properly dispose of all empty containers and construction debris.



- B. When erection work is complete, including all riveting, straightening, etc., all adhering rust, scale, grease, etc., shall be removed. Oil and grease by appropriate solvents; dust and dirt by wood fiber brush; scale and other adhering material by wire brush or sand blasting. All items are to then be washed cleaned. This also applies to concrete surface to be painted.
