Daniel Taylor, #1090 <i>Allegation D: Other- Divisional Values</i> CPRB Decision: <i>SUSTAINED</i> <i>Group Level II – Conduct Unbecoming</i> The Board found that on during his OPS interview he failed to display high moral and ethical standards which diminished the esteem of the CDP, specifically he stated he failed to remember the incident, even after reviewing record of the incident.	<i>Date Heard by Chief: 07/10/2026</i> Det. Daniel Taylor, #1090 <i>Allegation D: Other- Divisional Values</i> Chief Recommendation: Dismissed The Chief concluded the clear and convincing evidence showed Detective Taylor did not remember the incident due to the routine nature of his secondary-employment duties at JACK Casino, where he frequently escorted patrons and had no independent recollection of this particular event. The Chief found Taylor’s memory lapse reasonable. Based on these findings, the Chief recommends dismissal of Specification #2 and declined to impose discipline, requesting a CPRB response by September 4, 2026, pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Logan Weber, #2425 <i>Allegation A: Excessive Force</i> CPRB Decision: <i>SUSTAINED</i> <i>Group Level III – Excessive Force</i> The Board found that the WCS footage showed Officer Weber pushing Ms. Summers’ forehead down while already restrained, holding her arm in awkward and forceful position even after the complainant expressed discomfort.	<i>Date Heard by Chief: 07/10/2026</i> P.O. Logan Weber, #2425 <i>Allegation A: Excessive Force</i> Chief Recommendation: Dismissed The Chief concluded the CPRB’s findings were contrary to clear and convincing evidence shown by the WCS which shows Ms. Summers was able to use her hands, arms, and upper body so she was not “restrained to the hospital bed”. PO Weber only held Ms. Summers’ forehead after she tried to bite or spit at him. Additionally, PO Weber held her arm with minimum force, it was neither forceful nor awkward. Based on these findings, the Chief dismissal of Specification #1 and declined to impose discipline, requesting a CPRB response by September 4, 2026, pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement.
