Pipeline Infrastructure Improvements Update

Monday, May 23, 2022

**Dominion Energy Ohio Gas Pipeline Infrastructure Replacement Project –
PIR 223 – West 94th Street and Maywood Avenue
(City of Cleveland - Ward 11 and 14)**

CLEVELAND – On Monday, May 23, 2022, Dominion Energy Ohio’s gas pipeline infrastructure replacement project will begin on the following streets:

- West 94th Street – West side from Maywood Avenue to Almira Avenue
- West 91st Street – From Maywood Avenue to Almira Avenue
- West 90th Street – From Maywood Avenue to Almira Avenue
- West 88th Street – From Maywood Avenue to Almira Avenue
- West 86th Street – From Silverton Avenue to Almira Avenue
- West 82nd Street – From Almira Avenue to Denison Avenue
- Silverton Avenue – From West 88th Street to West 86th Street
- Almira Avenue – South side from West 94th Street to West 82nd Street

The improvements include replacing the old steel mainline with a new plastic mainline in the roadway and sidewalk area. A work zone will be established which will allow two-way traffic with traffic control personnel present to help direct traffic flow. Access to adjacent driveways and businesses will be maintained throughout construction. The work on the project will take place Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

This project is scheduled for completion in December 2022. Should the weather not allow for permanent restoration to the sidewalk and roadway after construction. A temporary 2’ thick concrete sidewalk will be installed for pedestrian traffic, and concrete road caps will be placed on all road crossings until permanent restorations can be completed in the spring of 2023.
