**East 185th Street Rehabilitation &
Streetscape Project
Traffic Advisory
Nottingham Road to Lake Erie
(Ward 8)**

Expect additional traffic notices as improvements continue

CLEVELAND – Beginning Monday, August 15, 2022, weather permitting, ODOT will begin construction of Phase 2 work on East 185th Street between Nottingham Road and Villaview Avenue. Northbound and southbound traffic will be maintained through the work zone.

In addition, Phase 1 work will continue between Windward and Lake Erie for the northern section of the project. One-way northbound traffic will continue to be maintained during construction in this section. On street parking is permitted on the side of the roadway being maintained during construction.

Southbound traffic will be detoured from East 185th Street to eastbound Lakeshore Boulevard; then to southbound East 200th Street and then to westbound St. Clair Avenue and back to East 185th Street. Two-way traffic will be maintained between Nottingham Road and Pawnee Avenue.

Additional side street closures may be necessary at times during construction. Detour signs will be posted as these occur. Advanced warning signs will be placed outside of the work area informing the public of the construction work and any changes in the traffic patterns. The work will generally take place during the hours of 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
