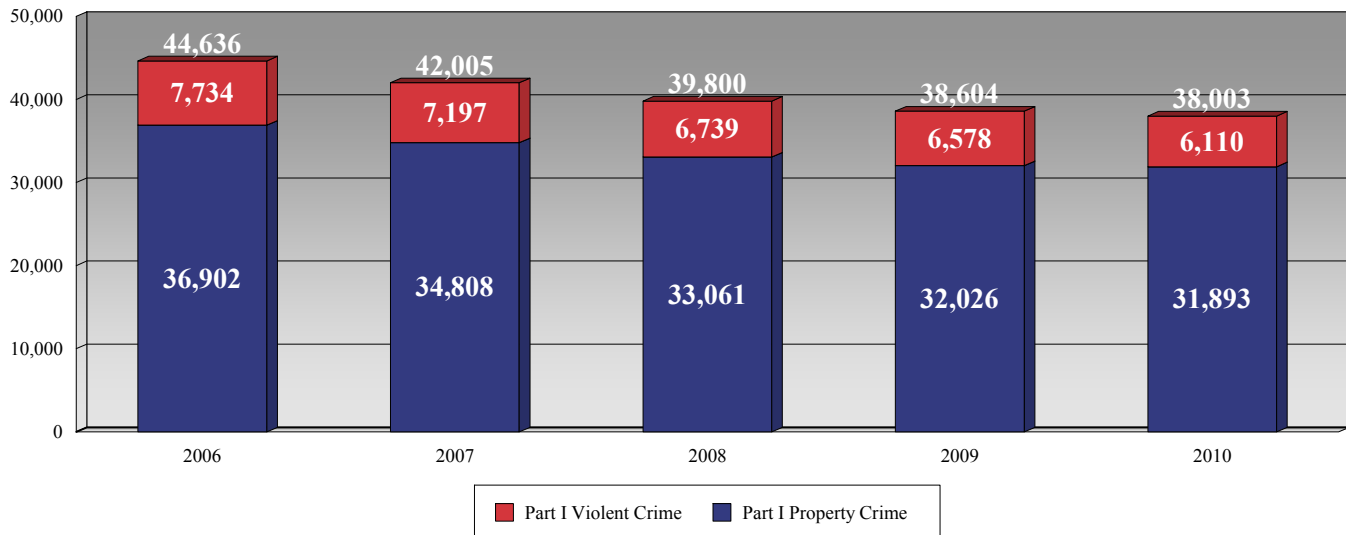

POLICE INCIDENT REPORTS

The data below represents the total number of police incident reports filed with the Cleveland Division of Police by year. The chart reflects a continuing decline of reported incidents within the City. From 2009 to 2010 Cleveland experienced a 2.5% decline in incident reports.

TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

The Division of Police experienced a slight increase in reported traffic accidents in 2010. From 2009 to 2010 there was an increase of 1.5%.

INCOMING CALL COUNTS / CAD INCIDENTS DISPATCHED 2006-2010

The Director of Public Safety directed that by the end of the second quarter in 2010, 95% of all incoming emergency 911 calls for service would be answered within fifteen seconds and 99% within 40 seconds. The Communications Center leadership was directed to coordinate with Public Safety to develop the capability to monitor and track compliance with this mandate. During the most recent monitoring period - Nov 19, 2010 through January 6, 2011 - that goal was met. On average, 96% of all incoming 911 calls were answered within fifteen seconds and 99% within 40 seconds. This performance target is consistent with industry best practices as established by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1221 Section 7.4.
