## **Pipeline Infrastructure Improvements Update**

**Monday, March 2, 2020**

**Dominion Energy Ohio Gas Pipeline Infrastructure Replacement  
Project – PIR 3203 – Loraine Avenue & West 98<sup>th</sup> Street  
(City of Cleveland - Ward 5)**

**CLEVELAND** – On Monday, March 2, 2020, Dominion Energy Ohio's gas pipeline infrastructure replacement project will begin on the following streets:

- Lorain Avenue – From West 98<sup>th</sup> Street to West 93<sup>rd</sup> Street
- West 98<sup>th</sup> Street – From Denison Avenue to Lorain Avenue
- West 97<sup>th</sup> Street – From Denison Avenue to Lorain Avenue
- West 95<sup>th</sup> Street – From Denison Avenue to Lorain Avenue
- West 94<sup>th</sup> Street – From Denison Avenue to Lorain Avenue

The improvements include replacing the old steel mainline with a new plastic mainline in the sidewalk area. A work zone will be established which will allow two-way traffic with traffic control personnel present to help direct traffic flow. Access to adjacent driveways will be maintained throughout construction. All work zones will be removed at the end of each work day. The work on the project will take place Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

This project is scheduled for completion in June 2020. Should the weather not allow for permanent restoration to the sidewalk, a temporary 2" thick concrete sidewalk will be installed for pedestrian traffic. A concrete cap will be placed on all road crossings until permanent concrete restorations can be completed.
