Below are a few guidelines you should know:

Medical Coverage: There is **NO** medical coverage for the 2022 Adult Softball Program.

Player Eligibility: You must have a validated contract card before playing in a game.
Your manager must have a copy of the contract card at every game.
Players must have a photo ID card available at every game.

Players must play in (6) games to be eligible for playoffs.

Illegal participants AND the team manager will be suspended for four games and the team will forfeit all victories in which an illegal participant played.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct will not be tolerated. Ask your manager to explain the conduct rules on pages 7 & 8 before the season begins. Also, alcoholic beverages are prohibited in Brookside and Gordon Parks; smoking is prohibited on the field or in the dugout.
